#### **Updates**

**Program Assessment Planning Meeting:** Faculty members were given an opportunity to learn about and discuss feedback tools pertaining to departmental assessment plans at a roundtable discussion that took place on Monday, October 17<sup>th</sup>.

**Educational Effectiveness Meeting:** The Educational Effectiveness working groups have submitted data rationales to the co-chairs and will be submitting drafts of their report outlines by October 20<sup>th</sup>. On Friday, October 21<sup>st</sup>, the larger committee will be meeting to review the rationales and outlines and give feedback to each of the subgroups. The meeting will also focus on how the subgroups can develop effective "story lines" from the drafts.

**Teaching Narrative Conference:** The First Annual Teaching Narrative Conference was held on October 14th and was a tremendous success, with 50 attendees. The conference featured a variety of engaging presentations and discussions of creative approaches to student learning. The day-long event included thoughtful conversations about the ways in which students and their teachers learn and innovative ways to facilitate active and interdisciplinary learning. **Student Artifacts Study (SAS):** The SAS marks a collaboration between the Brooklyn and C.W. Post campuses to evaluate multi-disciplinary samples of student writing from upper level writing intensive courses. Participating faculty and staff of the C.W. Post and Brooklyn campuses met on Friday Sept 30<sup>th</sup> for The Information Literacy and Written Expression Value Rubric Workshop. Faculty and staff discussed relevant considerations regarding essay evaluation. A follow up meeting was held on Friday Oct. 7<sup>th</sup>, which allowed evaluators the opportunity to address any questions or concerns about the process. Ultimately this data will be used to examine the current state of student learning in written communication and information literacy.
