Application Information and Instructions

General Information:

LIU's collaborative Master of Social Work (MSW) Program, with courses offered at the Post (Brookville) and Brooklyn Campuses, offers a high degree of specialization through its required second-year concentration. Students may focus in one of five areas: Child and Family Welfare, Forensics Social Work, Gerontology, Nonprofit Management, and Alcohol and Substance Abuse Counseling, all fields where there is significant hiring demand. There are two options within the Gerontology concentration: Long-Term Care Administration and Senior Community Service.

In an effort to reach its goal, the LIU MSW Program seeks applicants who have a broad liberal arts education consisting of the humanities, social and behavioral sciences, the natural sciences including biology, and courses reflective of a basic interest in human services. Additional admissions/application requirements include:

- A Bachelor of Arts or Science degree from an accredited college or university
- A minimum overall grade point average of 2.8
- A "B" (3.0) average in courses taken during the final four semesters of undergraduate study
- A minimum of three Letters of Recommendation
- A Personal Statement/Autobiographical Essay (4-5 pages in length), accompanied by a resume
- Personal character and qualifications essential for professional work with individuals who are vulnerable and populations-at-risk
- A possible interview
- The completion of the University and Program admission applications in a timely manner

Application Instructions:

All application and supporting documentation must be submitted by April 15. Admission decisions will be made after the April 15th application deadline.

All students are asked to complete the general *Application for Graduate Admission* in its entirety online at http://www.liu.edu/Brooklyn/Admissions/Apply.aspx.

In addition, students must submit a completed application package in the envelope provided that should include:

- A completed Student Credential Cover Sheet (enclosed or online at http://liu.edu/Brooklyn/Admissions/Forms-Documents.aspx) with the required \$40 non-refundable application fee via check or money order (no cash accepted) made payable to Long Island University.
- 2. "MSW Supplemental Application" (enclosed)
- 3. 1 official transcript from all undergraduate and graduate institutions attended
- 4. 3 Letters of Recommendation (Special "Letter of Reference" forms are enclosed)
- 5. 4 5 page Personal Statement/Autobiographical Essay (specific instructions enclosed)
- 6. A current Resume (specific instructions enclosed)

Instructions for MSW Personal Statement/Autobiographical Essay

As part of the application process, students have the opportunity to demonstrate their writing ability through a 4 - 5 page autobiographical statement. This statement allows LIU Brooklyn Faculty to determine whether the student has the writing skills necessary to perform successfully in the MSW program. Applicants should be certain that their autobiographical statement is a fair sample of their ability to express themselves in writing. The statement should include the material identified below and any other information the student feels may be important when considering the application for admission.

- 1. Describe why you have chosen to pursue the profession of social work. In writing this description, please address the following: What influenced your choice? What makes you believe that you will be an effective social worker? What are your career goals? What if any alternative careers have you explored?
- 2. Describe an experience in which you exercised leadership, responsibility, and/or judgment, and discuss what you learned from that experience.
- 3. Discuss a contemporary social problem. Include possible causes and potential solutions in your response. What course of action do you recommend? Discuss the potential benefits and drawbacks of your preferred plan.
- 4. If there is anything else you would like us to know as we consider your application, please describe.
- 5. Please submit a detailed resume in chronological order, specifying the name of the organization and identifying the following information:
 - a. All paid social service positions, including whether the position was full-time or part-time, type of work, by whom it was supervised, and the nature of the client population.
 - b. All volunteer social service positions (camps, hospitals, etc), indicating whether the position was full-time or part-time, type of work, by whom it was supervised, and the nature of the client population.
 - c. All paid positions held other than social service agencies (including military experience).
 - d. The resume should also include descriptions of leadership activities, other relevant life experiences, and all languages read and/or spoken in addition to English.

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For Advanced Standing Applicants Only

Advanced Standing students are admitted into the program and begin with the second year, eliminating the foundation year.

Advanced standing status is only awarded to graduates of baccalaureate social work programs accredited by CSWE. To be eligible, students must hold a BSW or equivalent from an undergraduate program that is accredited by CSWE. Each student must apply for advanced standing and each case is reviewed individually. Please note that holding a BSW does not automatically grant a student advanced standing and the student must apply and be accepted.

The deadline for all Advanced Standing applicants is April 1. Those admitted must be prepared to take SWK 614, *Advanced Principles of Administrative and Clinical Practice within an Interdisciplinary Context*, which runs from July through August preceding beginning of their first fall semester. Upon successful completion of this course with a grade of B or better, students advance to the concentration curriculum, at which time one of the five concentrations is selected.

In order to be eligible for Advanced Standing, applicants must:

- 1. Have an overall undergraduate GPA of 3.0 or better, and a GPA of 3.5 or better in all social work classes.
- 2. Demonstrate that they have mastered the foundation year content through their BSW program.
- 3. Provide a reference from the undergraduate field director speaking to the level of competence as a generalist social worker and with a recommendation specifically for advanced standing.
- 4. Be within five years of the completion of their BSW.
- 5. Participate in an individual or group interview.
