How did your involvement change you?

Your essay should be 2-3 double-spaced, typed pages in length. Be sure to put your name on the essay.

- Receive academic advisement, guidance and counseling. Early registration is also provided.
- Earn the Honors College designation on your transcript and diploma upon graduation. This distinction makes you more competitive for professional or graduate school as well as for other career opportunities.
- Receive e-mail correspondence informing you of program events and inviting you to social and cultural activities. You will also be advised of employment, scholarship and fellowship opportunities.
- Attend the Senior Dinner and other Honors graduation events.
