LEARNING SUPPORT CENTER

The Learning Support Center (LSC) provides a full range of support services, educational strategies and opportunities to help students achieve their personal, academic and vocational goals. LSC services include the **Academic Resource Program** for students with documented learning disabilities and/or ADHD; **Disability Support Services** for students with all types of documented disabilities; the **Program for Academic Success** for students who do not qualify for regular admission to the university; and the **Peer Tutoring Program**, which provides tutoring to undergraduate students at no cost. Offices are located in the Learning Support Center in Post Hall, lower level, east wing.

Academic Resource Program

The Academic Resource Program (ARP) is a comprehensive, structured support program designed to meet the needs of undergraduate students who have been evaluated by a qualified professional and certified as having a learning disability and/or attention deficit hyperactivity disorder. Students work one-on-one with a trained learning assistant, receive assistance with organization and time management and have the use of our up-to-date computer lab equipped with assistive technology.

Disability Support Services

The Office of Disability Support Services (DSS) coordinates services for students with disabilities at LIU Post as well as the university's regional campuses to ensure equal access to all of LIU's programs, services and facilities. DSS works with students with disabilities and the LIU community to create an accessible and supportive environment. It also assists students who have submitted appropriate documentation in securing the necessary accommodations from academic departments and other offices, if needed. The policies and procedures of the DSS office meet the requirements of Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1972 and the Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990. Program for Academic Success

The Program for Academic Success (PAS) was created to assist freshmen who do not meet LIU Post's admission requirements but demonstrate potential for academic success. The goal of this one-year academic program is to help students become matriculated without restriction by providing a reduced course load, smaller class size, support services, and continuous evaluation during the freshman year. Admission is based on the student's potential and motivation to succeed in a college environment. Program benefits include:

- Smaller class sizes to provide individual attention
- Faculty-taught labs (one hour per week for academic subjects within the program)
- Academic tutors
- Individual guidance and monitoring by PAS staff
- PAS advisor to facilitate course registration
