The LIU Travel Grant program provides aid to undergraduate students with demonstrated financial need who wish to attend courses that takes place outside the United States during the Winter and/or Summer terms. In order to be eligible for this award, students must be in good financial standing, file a Free Application for Federal Student Aid at [fafsa.gov](http://fafsa.gov), and be qualified to receive a Federal Pell Grant. Visiting and graduate students are not eligible for this award. Travel insurance and fees associated with the course are the student’s responsibility and must be paid in full prior to departure to receive this award. Award amounts are based on the Pell chart below and apply only to the tuition and fees associated with the course. This award does not apply to other expenses such as travel, lodging, etc.

**Summer: May 1**

**Winter: December 1**

**Travel Grant FAQs**

**1. How are “study abroad courses” defined for the purposes of this award?**

Study Abroad programs include any course that takes place outside the United States and is offered during the Winter or Summer sessions.

**2. How is eligibility determined?**

Undergraduate students who have filed a FAFSA for the current term and qualified for a Pell Grant are eligible to receive this award.

**3. What types of costs can an award apply to?**

An award can apply up to \$1,000 towards the tuition and fees associated with a course. The award does not apply to other expenses that may be associated with the course, such as travel, lodging, etc.

**4. Will I be required to expand my existing student health insurance coverage as a participant in a study abroad course?**

The University provides students studying abroad with accident and sickness insurance during the length of the course at a nominal per diem rate which will be billed to your student account.

**5. What is the deadline for filing my application?**

Summer travel applications are due by May 1st; winter applications are due by December 1st.

**6. When will I be notified if I've qualified for an award?**

You will be notified within one business day of filing your application with the Enrollment Services office on your campus.

**7. Do I need to be a full-time student to qualify?**

Students must be enrolled full-time in an undergraduate degree program; visiting and graduate students are not eligible for this award.

**8. Can I qualify for more than one award if I take multiple student abroad courses in a given winter and/or summer session?**

Students can only apply for one award each session.
