Judith Tabler is a retired Assistant Professor of Literature and Languages at Marymount University, an Instructor at The Writer's Center in Bethesda, MD, an author, and a freelance writer and photographer. Prior to joining Marymount, Tabler worked in the Education Department at the Folger Shakespeare Library in Washington, DC. During her time there, she was Director of the Folger Shakespeare Student Festival Project, which was funded by the U.S. Department of

Education, where she traveled throughout the country holding workshops for elementary and high school teachers on teaching Shakespeare. After leaving Folger, she joined the staff of Columbia Books as an editor.

Tabler published a picture book, *The New Puppy*, which was voted Best Children's Book of the Year by the National Dog Writer's Association of America, and 4 non-fiction books on dog breeds. She worked as a freelance writer for National Geographic in the educational department and her articles have appeared in magazines such as *Appleseeds*, *Calliope*, *Science Weekly*, *Renaissance*, *The World & I*, *Dog Fancy*, *Scholastic Magazine Teacher's Guide*, *Kennel Review*, *Pure-Bred Dogs/American Kennel Gazette*, *Dogs in Canada* and *D Magazine*. Her most recent book, "Foxhunting with Meadow Brook", explores the history of foxhunting on Long Island.

Tabler has authored reference books, biographies, non-fiction narratives, and children's picture books. She earned a Masters of Education in English from the University of Virginia, and a Masters of Fine Arts from Lesley University.
