Karl Rove served as Senior Advisor to President George W. Bush from 2000-2007 and Deputy Chief of Staff from 2004-2007. At the White House, he oversaw the Offices of Strategic Initiatives, Political Affairs, Public Liaison, and Intergovernmental Affairs and was Deputy Chief of Staff for Policy, coordinating the White House policy-making process.

Before Rove became known as "The Architect" of

President Bush's 2000 and 2004 campaigns, he was President of Karl Rove + Company, an Austin-based public affairs firm that worked for over 75 Republican candidates for senator, governor and congressman, as well as non-partisan causes and non-profit groups.

Today, Mr. Rove writes a weekly op-ed for the *Wall Street Journal* and is a Fox News contributor. He is the author of two books - a critically acclaimed volume on the 1896 presidential election entitled *The Triumph of William McKinley* and the 2010 New York Times best-seller *Courage and Consequence*. He is now working on a book on presidential decision-making. He is the Founder of the American Crossroads/ Senate Leadership Fund super-PAC.
